

Third Sunday of Easter

In the gospel (Lk 24:35-48) our all-knowing and seeing God has come to answer the disciples' questions, relieve their fears, strengthen their faith, and instill confidence for their mission. Two disciples recount to everyone how they spent the day with Jesus on the road to Emmaus, but they did not recognize Him until evening when he "took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them" (Lk 24:25-30). While they were still speaking Jesus appeared and said. "Peace be with you." The disciples were "terrified" and "thought" (not spoke) they were seeing a ghost. For nothing is concealed from God but everything is naked and exposed to Him whom we must render an account (Heb 4:13). Jesus answers all their questions and dispels their anxiety. "Touch me" for a spirit does not have a body. Look at my hands and feet (wounds). The disciples are "incredulous" (unbelieving) but filled with "joy "and awe. Jesus asks for food and eats it to further prove His body is real. He reminds them of His words spoken before the crucifixion, opens their understanding, and affirms their purpose: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

The disciples' distress reminds us of God's undying love, intimate knowledge, and desire to meet our every true need (not our every desire). Those needs that will put us firmly back on the road of salvation and our mission. The two disciples spend the day talking with Jesus on the road about scriptures but are too agitated about the crucifixion to realize it. These are the times we need to remember some of the many words He left us with: "I will never fail you nor forsake you" (Heb 13:5). Ask for the assurance He has to strengthen your faith for even when we don't recognize Jesus, He is never absent or not working in our lives through the Holy Spirit. We need to "touch" Him and allow Him to dispel our fears. Meditate on His wounds in the Sorrowful Mysteries and know His great love for you. The disciples testified they recognized Jesus during the breaking of the bread. Receive the Eucharist with new faith. Jesus will provide exactly what you need. Then return to your vocation (Single Life, Married, Priesthood, and Religious) renewed by His life. Recognize the many ways Jesus is present: in our hearts, through the Holy Spirit, in the Eucharist, at Confession, during prayer, speaking in Scripture, through our brethren, and in our midst at Mass. Will you reach out and touch Jesus? - Diana Nussberger
