It is mandatory that parents and Godparents attend.




Blessed Sacrament

4th Sunday of Easter

Today Jesus identifies himself as the one true shepherd of the Church. (Jn 10:11-18). "I am the good shepherd." Who lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man looking after the sheep abandons the sheep when the wolf [the Devil] comes because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. Then the Devil catches some and scatters others. Jesus cares for our every need because of His love and devotion to His creation. "Know that the Lord is God! It is he that made us, and we are his: we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture" (Ps 100:3). Jesus emphasizes our union with Him: "I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father." Jesus will lay down His life (on the cross) for the sheep. He references future believers: "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd. The Father's love shows through Jesus as he speaks of willingly laying down his life and taking it up again (at the Resurrection). Has the Trinitarian God Jesus had sovereign power over life and death: "No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. This command I have received from my Father." These powerful statements remind us of God's complete authority over creation and of what His death and resurrection has done for us.

This gospel speaks of the only shepherd of our Faith (Jesus), the hired man (that has no concern for us), and our enemy the Devil. Jesus' death and resurrection gave us the new covenant of salvation through faith in what He has accomplished for us. "Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus. the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in you that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ" (Heb.13:20-22). He has provided everything for our sanctification process. Let us resist thoughts and actions that don't line up with Christ's teaching, consult the Holy Spirit, and recognize that the Devil, although defeated, will tempt us to doubt and sin. The more we mediate on His voice through Scripture, pray, and frequent the Sacraments the easier it is to brush aside these attacks, walk in the Spirit that does not gratify the flesh (sin less often), and grow in our conversion so the fruits of our new nature surface more often: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, and self-control (Gal. 5:22-23). How can you cooperate more with the sanctification process?
